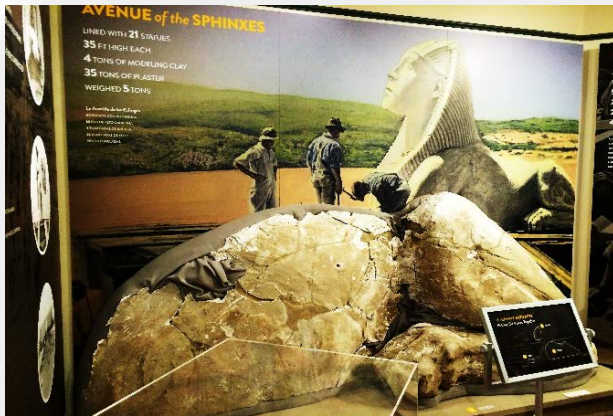

October General Meeting

Monday October 17th

Our October General Meeting will be held on **October 17** at the Women's Club in Arroyo Grande. We are fortunate to have a special program and speaker for the meeting. Dr. Ellen Broido is an associate professor of higher education and student affairs at Bowling Green State University, where she has worked since 2001. She teaches in both the master's in College Student Personnel program and the doctorate in Higher Education Administration program. She also serves as an affiliated faculty member in Women's Studies.

Dr. Broido's research focuses on diversity and social justice issues in higher education and on international perspectives on student affairs work. She is spending her sabbatical year here on the Central Coast and will share with us some of the interesting research she has done.

The title of Dr. Broido's talk is:

"You get so mad because you don't want to say anything but you wish you did": Women's responses to gendered experiences working in higher education.

Dr Broido writes:

"How do women who have worked at the same university for 25 or more years describe their experiences with gendered interactions? In this talk, I discuss the findings from interviews with 36 hourly, administrative, and faculty women about the role of gender in their work, and how that changed over the course of their careers. In particular, I will focus on the kinds of interactions women did and didn't label as sexism, the variety of ways they reacted to their experiences, and the implications for training university faculty and staff and designing policy."

As usual, the meeting will begin at 6:30 with refreshments and time for mingling. **The program will begin promptly at 7:00.** Don't miss this sure-to-be interesting and relevant program. Guests are welcome too!

National is offering special discounts to increase membership. If you bring a potential member to a meeting and they decide to join on the spot, they only have to pay 1/2 of national dues. That would be a savings of \$24.50. This means they can join for \$65.50 for a one year membership.

There is also "Shape the Future" where anyone joining during a public event will only have to pay half of national dues. Again \$65.50 for one year.

And lastly "Give a Grad" is a program that gives graduates within the last 2 years of graduation a free one year National and State membership. It's up to the individual branches if they wish to also add a free year's membership. Our local dues are \$21, so a new grad can join for \$21 or less.
