Presidents' Message

Leadership Challenge What is Our Responsibility? What Role Will You Take?

As an organization we have a commitment to our community and ourselves to fulfill our mission, follow our bylaws and policies, and provide opportunities for leadership within our organization and in the community. Our mission of **advancing equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy and research can only be achieved if we have a viable organization.**

What makes a viable organization? Local leadership and that means members of our Branch must step up and assist in the guidance of our Branch.

The following officer positions are currently open and necessary for our Branch to function effectively.

Vice President Membership: Initiates and coordinates branch recruitment efforts. Coordinates branch social events and new member orientations. Keeps an accurate list of branch members, working with the treasurer to keep the membership directory current and accurate. Ensures that branch records match AAUW membership records; and works with AAUW staff to correct errors.

Vice President Programs: Incorporates AAUW and AAUW-CA program themes and priorities into the branch program and creates a branch calendar of programs that fulfill AAUW's mission. <u>Delegates</u> responsibilities for each program, including but not limited to: securing meeting space, publicity, branch newsletter articles, gaining board approval for speaker honoraria, providing for speaker's equipment, and arranging hospitality refreshments. Prepares a program agenda and introduces programs at the general meetings.

President Elect: The president-elect is the elected president for the succeeding year and succeeds to the office without further election. To qualify for this position, the president-elect must have served as a board member at some time. This position serves as a learning role for the next year.

Tech Trek Chairperson: Supervises fundraising for scholarships, and the selection and registration of the branch's Tech Trek recipients. Acts as liaison between the local AAUW branch and the director(s) of the local Tech Trek camp(s). This includes reporting the number of girls to be sent (October), amending as necessary, sending in funds in a timely manner (by March 1, working with branch treasurer) and ensuring a good understanding of the camp procedures by reading the state information carefully when it is sent in November.

TECH TREK & HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDS NIGHT APRIL 21, 2014 7:00 PM St. John's Church 959 Valley Road, Arroyo Grande (Los Berros Road Entrance)



Tech Trek and College Scholarships will be awarded at our April 21st Branch Meeting. This event will be held at St. John's Church in Arroyo Grande. Members and guests should arrive by 7:00 p.m., and the program will begin as soon as guests have been signed in by the committees.

Tech Trek is a math and science camp for girls entering 8th grade held each summer on college campuses across California. The Tech Trek scholarship recipients from the Five Cities-Pismo Beach Branch of AAUW will attend the week-long, residential camp at UCSB from July 27th to August 2nd. The 2014 recipients will be introduced, and 2013 Tech Trek campers will describe their Tech Trek experiences.

Tech Trek finances are handled by the Special Projects Fund (SPF) of AAUW California, a 501 (c) (3) entity which accepts tax deductible donations. In addition to branch fundraising, scholarships are funded by local corporations and service groups and donations from AAUW members and other local residents.

The Tech Trek Committee is co-chaired by Liz Wineman and Sue Singer. Committee members are: Susan Archdeacon, Judy Gabriel, and Jane Pittenger. Special thanks goes to Sandra Ku for her invaluable assistance in arranging the Superintendent's Office for interviews and for working with the Committee on Interviewing Day.

The Pismo Beach-Five Cities AAUW Scholarship Committee will also be presenting the recipients of the 2014 Academic Scholarships at the April 21st meeting. The recipients are deserving high school girls graduating from Arroyo Grande High School and Nipomo High School.

The Scholarship Committee is a 501 (c) (3) entity, dedicated to providing scholarships to senior women in the Lucia Mar Unified School District. The goal of the Scholarship Committee is to establish an endowment of at least \$100,000, which will provide a minimum of two \$1,000 scholarships annually in perpetuity. Each year, monies may be contributed to either the endowment or to local scholarship funds.

The Scholarship Committee this year is comprised of eleven active members. Judy Leonard and Priscilla Alquist co-chair this committee. Judy Zaretzka is the Chief Financial Officer, Maureen Kelly is Vice-President and Pat Muhlethaler is Secretary. Members at large include: Debbie Audet, Elvera Hornung, Beth Hutton, Kathi Pettersen, Andi Portney, and Nancy Kington.

A social time will follow after the presentations, and members are invited to speak with the High School and Tech Trek scholarship recipients and their families. This uninterrupted social time will allow us to focus on the girls and their families and to celebrate their achievements.

Tech Trek Seeks New Chairpersons



I was the recipient of an AAUW scholarship in 2009. I wanted to thank you again for your investment in my education. In June of 2013, I graduated from UCLA with a Bachelor's of Science in An-



thropology. I received Departmental Highest Honors on my diploma. I also earned minors in Gerontology and Public Health.

While at UCLA, I was a founding member of the Alpha Chi Omega sorority on campus. Instead of going abroad, I spent a quarter in Washington, D.C., where I interned for the American Red Cross and wrote a research paper about the organizational response to the 2010 earthquake in Haiti. During my junior year, I was one of eight students selected to do a research paper of my own design. I worked on this project for two years. In the end, my research was published in a national student journal and I made a presentation in front my department detailing my findings. AAUW WASHINGTON UPDATE

In this week's issue of *Washington Update*, you'll find information about new proposals from the Obama administration on overtime pay and for-profit colleges; a just-announced bipartisan Senate deal to retroactively extend unemployment insurance; a state paycheck fairness bill that unanimously passed the New Hampshire Senate; and early reports that the Senate is expected to vote on the Paycheck Fairness Act and a federal minimum wage increase – two major AAUW priorities – sometime in April.

If this week's events show us anything, it's that lawmakers across the country are finally starting to talk about – and in some cases, take real, meaningful action on – issues that affect women and girls. That means it'll be up to you to hold your elected officials accountable and make sure they talk the talk and walk the walk.

We'll keep you posted as developments unfold, and we promise to give you opportunities to make your voice heard in your community and in Washington, D.C. We hope you'll also share with us any activities you're organizing on these policy issues, and for Equal Pay Day as well. 
