Shirley joined our Branch when her daughter, Carol McBirnie was active in the Branch. Shirley received her degree in English from Cal-State Fresno at the age of 62. World War II had interfered with her early college plans because she needed employment.

She started Fresno City College about the time Carol finished in 1975. She was 43 at the time. She earned AA degrees in Art and Real Estate. She made the Dean's list several times. She had almost 200 units at Fresno City College, and was allowed to transfer only 100 to Fresno State. After a semester at Fresno State she decided to quit because she could not stand the egos of so many of the professors in English and decided she did not want to pay for their instruction (her Irish temperament). When she went to withdraw at the campus someone at the desk asked her if she was over a certain age, which she was, and told her that if she was, she could attend for free. She decided at that moment it was too good a deal to pass up so she stayed enrolled. She graduated on her daughter's 30th birthday (May 18th) in 1985 with a BA in English. She was the second oldest graduate.

Many of our members are of the generation where a college degree for a woman became more common. It's inspiring to hear the stories of the women who were of an earlier generation and successfully completed a degree. Thank you, Carol, for sharing your Mom and her story.

#### SCHOLARSHIP "CORPORATION"?

Yes, what many Branch members refer to as the 'Scholarship Committee", as records show, has been a corporation since 2000. It is officially called, "FIVE CITIES PISMO BEACH AAUW SCHOLARSHIP"

The executive Board of Directors includes: CEO, Marilyn Corey; VP, Kathi Pettersen; CFO, Carol Rowe; and Secretary, Pat Muhlethaler. Other Branch members serving as Scholarship Corporation Board members are: Barbara Cotton, Erica Hinojosa, Beth Hutton, Maureen Kelly, Joan Knowlton, Jean Slater, Rose Ann Steiner, and Yvonne Stephens.

The Scholarship Corporation continues to welcome donations. When the Endowment Fund was established, with a goal of \$100,000, the interest rates at that time would have easily funded one \$1000 scholarship each year at Arroyo Grande High School. Since then, there are now three high schools and today's interest rates are so low, the Scholarship Corporation still needs to "grow" the Endowment Fund in order to fund three scholarships with the yield of the Fund.

Please consider a donation to the Scholarship Corporation Endowment Fund. Your donation is tax deductible since the Scholarship Corporation is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization.

We look forward to the day when the Endowment Fund yield will be able to sustain one scholarship, of at least \$1000 or maybe even more, for each high school in the Lucia Mar School District.






