GREAT DECISIONS

The first three topics for the 2018 Great Decisions include the following.

The waning of Pax Americana presents a discussion on the historic shift from the liberal international order that was established in the wake of World War II, in which Pax Americana promised peaceful international relations and an open economy buttressed by U.S. military power. "American First", isolationism, a political mood toward selective U.S. engagement, where foreign commitments are limited to areas of vital U.S. interests is championed by President Trump. Geopolitical allies and challengers are paying close attention. What might be the outcome?

Russia is projecting an autocratic model of government abroad and is working toward destabilizing liberal democracies under President Valimir Putin. What is Putin's conception of national interest and how should the U.S. respond to Putin's attempts to spread right wing authoritarianism?

China has implemented an expansive strategy of economic diplomacy in the Asia Pacific region and beyond. Where the U. S. has taken a step back, China is making inroads through Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank and more. What are China's geopolitical objectives? What do its actions mean for the international balance of power and how should the U.S. respond?

These are just the first three topics to be discussed. Other discussion areas include **Media** and foreign policy, Turkey: a partner in crisis, U.S. Defense Budget, South Africa, and Global Health.

As a citizen of the world you are invited to join in these discussions. Great Decisions meets monthly at the home of Mary Jo Aspinall to discuss world events, view a video and follow up a reading from the Great Decisions Foreign Policy Association publication.
