
Girls learn about STEM careers that align with their passions and help them solve big problems:

Scholarship Corporation News

The AAUW Scholarship Corporation Committee is in full-swing for 2018. After the team planning meeting last September and the first corporation meeting in October, directors have been busy contacting high schools, duplicating and distributing applications, working with high school counselors and reminding schools of the application deadline. Scholarship applications are due March 8, 2018.

The subsequent corporation meeting was held on February 27. Directors were given assignments to do the following: review all applications for completeness, duplicate all applications and deliver them to the readers. Three people will read and rate each application from each school.....Arroyo Grande High School, Nipomo High School, New Tech High School and AVID (students from both Arroyo Grande and Nipomo High Schools enrolled in the AVID program.) After the applications have been read and rated, the information is sent to the corporation directors. At the March 22 corporation meeting the application finalists will be selected and dates set up at the high schools for the interview process. After the interviews the scores are then added to the application scores and emailed to the directors, ready for a final selection of the four scholarship winners.

Serving on the Scholarship Corporation Committee is a rewarding and educational experience, and besides we have a lot of fun working together!
