Scholarship Update

The Five Cities –Pismo Beach Scholarship Board of Directors met on October 16. The Scholarship Investment Policy was discussed and a revision is in the works. The 2018-2019 Scholarship Application was updated. It was decided that four scholarships will be awarded for the 2018-2019

year at the amount of \$1,500 each, one to each high school and one Avid Scholarship. Members of the Scholarship Board of Directors will be contacting the schools in October. The Scholarship Financial Summary includes an ending balance at Rabobank of \$7,361.43. All scholarships have been paid for this year. The Endowment Fund has a balance of 110,858.35 as of September 30, 2018.

Public Policy Update

AAUW California 2018 Legislative Year Update By Shannon Smith Crowley, AAUW Legislative Advocate

If you've been tracking AAUW California legislation in the last few years, you'll note the number of bills related to closing the gender pay gap. We've made tremendous headway since 2015 working with the Stronger California coalition. The Fair Pay Act has been improved (<u>SB 358</u>–2015, <u>SB 1063</u> - 2016) and California now limits the use of one's prior salary to establish a new salary. Just this year, an additional refinement was made (<u>AB 2282</u> – Eggman) so there is no doubt, an employer cannot inquire or use one's prior salary. There are still <u>other areas to be addressed</u>, including pay data transparency so that employers and the public can better understand a company's pay practices. Unfortunately our cosponsored bill on this issue (<u>SB 1284</u>– Jackson) was stalled in the legislative process this year.

Momentum on the equal pay bills was assisted by the #MeToo movement and awareness that sexual harassment is fueled by disproportionate power dynamics, as is the gender pay gap. Many bills made it to the Governor's desk, with <u>mixed results</u>. Most importantly, Governor Brown signed <u>SB 1300</u> (Jackson), also known as the "no free grope" bill.

Our work is not done. To quote a former Governor, "we'll be back", to work with the new Governor to accomplish all that needs to be done to make California a bastion of equity and fairness for women.
