

Another year of Tech Trek camps has come and gone. We were fortunate enough to send our nominated candidates to the in-person camps at UCSB for the first time in several years. Thanks to your efforts at fundraising for our branch we were able to fund this year's campers and have money set aside for next year's camps, too. I thought you would enjoy seeing some of the quotes shared in thank you letters from campers who attended camp in July.

- "I had my intelligence being underestimated because I am a woman. So, I have been looking for a place that accepts me and for people who have been through what I have been through. And now that I have found it, I finally feel like I belong."
- "I heard that this camp was "life changing" but I underestimated how true these words actually were. I NEVER would have thought that 6 days could alter my life, but here I am. I am a changed person heading in a direction that will make for an amazing journey. I had always known that STEM was my passion, but now I have the tools and resources to get where I always wanted to be."
- "I learned many things at this camp, but the thing that I improved most on was gaining confidence. When I first attended this camp, I was really shy and nervous, but by the end I came out of my comfort zone."
- "In only a week I've learned and grown more than I thought possible."
- "I also learned a lot about perseverance, failure and friendship (also a little bit about independence and facing fears away from home)."
- "I really like how Tech Tek challenges me to meet new people and to use skills they taught us....They made us really think and didn't give us instant wins...really helped my thinking skills."

AAUW Scholarship Response August 2022

1. When you were announced at our AAUW April Meeting as one of our scholarship recipients, were you honored to be designated as one of the AVID winners?

I was super excited, this was the very first scholarship which I had earned, so it felt really good not only being a recipient, but also being able to say that AVID had helped me and my peers succeed. I was also just very happy that all my efforts of scholarship applications were being acknowledged.

2. Are you personally proud to be an AVID student and a former member of the AVID Program at your high school? Please explain?

I truly am proud of having been involved in the AVID program. Now that I am on my college campus, I can say that the AVID program helped me achieve this, through taking the SAT, AP classes, and just being there as emotional support during stressful times and the entire application process. Also, with having been the AVID president it helped me with my time management, planning, and socializing with others who I don't truly know, and now works as a conversation starter as I meet new people on campus.

- 3. Is there anything AAUW can do to improve our scholarship program?

 I truly don't think there is much to change, I really loved the intimacy of the interviews and how in depth they were, because it really felt like more of a casual conversation and true statement of character. The only thing, is that as some families are a bit busy, and the scholarship awarding meeting is also a club meeting, maybe we could be told that we could join or arrive around 15 minutes later than the time stated, because with ending the school day, needing to go home, get ready, and then go, there is a lot of stress.

I also really liked that the club members had a good amount of questions already prepared to ask us, because when there aren't enough questions it makes the interviewee feel bad and unsuccessful if leaving before the allotted time for the interview. I also like how each club member took turns speaking, because it does not feel overly stressful or targeted.
- 6. Did you feel honored at the AAUW April Meeting, when you were presented along with the other recipients, and encouraged to speak about your dreams for the future?

I did feel honored, I liked that there was a short statement made about each one of us, and that we then got to speak. What I had noticed was different in this meeting than all of the others I attended, was the fact that we got to introduce our guest, which I thought was super nice and really appreciates and acknowledges the efforts of the parents or guests who we choose to take to this meeting.



When Women Vote, We Change the Conversation!

Since 1881, AAUW has been a leading voice promoting education and equity for women and girls. AAUW encourages women voters to get involved in the political process and gain a better understanding of the impact legislative action can have on our lives.

The recent US Supreme Court Dobbs decision on abortion has stimulated action in many states across the nation, including California. Our legislature passed and Governor Newsom signed AB1666 which will enable a woman coming into California to receive an abortion to be protected from lawsuits originating in her home state. This bill was co-sponsored by AAUW CA! A further step protecting a woman's right to make personal medical decisions is a Constitutional Amendment, Proposition 1, which will be on the November 8 ballot. It would amend the California Constitution to prohibit the state from denying or interfering with an individual's reproductive freedom in her most intimate decisions, which includes the fundamental right to choose to have an abortion and the fundamental right to choose or refuse contraceptives.

AAUW CA supports this Constitutional Amendment. Congressional races are particularly important this November. Redistricting after the 2020 Census has changed the boundaries of many Congressional districts. In the current partisan climate, we need to be aware of what is at stake in both our national and state upcoming elections. Your current member of Congress may no longer represent you – be sure to become informed soon on the candidates for Congress in your district. As you sort through all this, please reflect on priority issues affecting us, our daughters, and granddaughters, and evaluate candidates' positions on these issues.

If you are a leader in your branch, make your October program a focus on the election. You may want to consider a Candidates Night. Before a partisan election, AAUW branches may host candidate forums to which **all** major-party candidates in that election are invited. AAUW branches with 501(c)(4) status must make a thorough and good faith effort to ensure the participation of at least two candidates for a specific office but may proceed with a forum if only one candidate accepts. AAUW branches with 501(c)(3) status may only proceed with a candidate forum event if at least two

candidates have accepted the invitation.


